The REHIS Annual Environmental Health Forum provides all Environmental Health Professionals in both the public and private sectors an opportunity to maintain and enhance their knowledge, skills and competence.

This year's Forum with the theme of 'Making the difference to Public Health' will consist of a whole day plenary session (Wednesday, 24 April) and morning only workshop sessions (Thursday 25 April). The plenary sessions will cover a wide range of topical updates relevant to professionals operating at all levels in their organisations. The workshop sessions will cover Food Safety and Food Standards; Occupational Health and Safety; Public Health and Housing; and Pollution Control and Environmental Protection. Delegates to the workshops can choose between Occupational Health and Safety; Public Health and Housing and between Food Safety and Food Standards, and Pollution Control and Environmental Protection.

Anyone with an interest in Environmental Health including Environmental Health Officers, Food Safety Officers, Environmental Health Technical Support Staff and Course Presenters from REHIS Approved Training Centres are very welcome to attend. The venue, the New Lanark Mill Hotel is a four-star hotel on the banks of the River Clyde adjacent to the historic New Lanark Mills.

The programme for this year's Forum will be launched this month and will contain full details of presentations, speakers and prices.

The New Lanark Mill Hotel has a limited number of rooms and prompt booking is recommended. In addition to the hotel rooms there is a range of self-catering accommodation including one and two bedroom on-site cottages and off-site hostel accommodation in the centre of Lanark (www.newlanarkhotel.co.uk).

There is ample car parking at the venue, care should be taken on the narrow road leading down to the venue from Lanark.

For delegates arriving at Lanark bus station or Lanark train station should be aware that the venue is a just under three miles from the centre of Lanark.

A regular bus service connects the centre of Lanark with the venue. The bus, number 135 and operated by Stuart's Coaches Ltd (<https://bustimes.org/services/135-lanark-circular-new-lanark>) leaves stance D of the bus station on Vincent Street, Lanark runs every hour and takes approximately 12 minutes.
